Back in January of this year, the Zoroastrian Association of Houston celebrated an event organized jointly by FIRES and the ZAH Library. The 2-day event was organized to honor Bapsi Sidhwa, showcase the wide range of talented authors in the Zoroastrian community in North America and to announce the newly instituted biennial "Bapsi Sidhwa Literary Prize". The first-of-its-kind prize is to be awarded once every two years to a writer who best captures the mood, spirit, and settings that were the essence of Bapsi's novels.



After receiving entries from India, United Kingdom, Canada, and the US, we selected an independent panel of three recognized judges to select the winner.

The first winner of this award was announced at a glittering ceremony at the 12th World Zoroastrian Congress 2022 in New York on Saturday, July 2, 2022. The winner of the Award is **Tanaz Bhathena** for her fascinating book, *Hunted by the Sky*.



Tanaz received a cash prize of \$2,000 along with a custom-made medal made especially for this Prize. Our congratulations to Tanaz for her achievement. Unfortunately, Tanaz could not be present at the Congress but accepted the award with a gracious and heartfelt acceptance speech that was shown at the Congress. 

Odds and Ends

At the World Congress:

Zoroastrian Digital Humanities: From Ancient Texts to Digital Data

A very interesting session at the 12the Zoroastrian World Congress was mysteriously titled *Digital Humanities* – a phrase not very familiar to most of us. In fact, it is a simple concept that seeks to create and preserve human records in digital formats. The session had four speakers on the varied ways digitization is aiding research, education and preservation.

The Multimedia Yasna (MUYA) project at SOAS has recorded the performance and written transmission of the core ritual of the Zoroastrian tradition, the Yasna, whose oldest parts date from the second millennium BCE and whose existence is now under threat. In Houston, we were fortunate to have heard about this project from Dr. Almut Hinze and even "saw" parts of the ceremony through the virtual reality headset that she brought.

The City College of New York Archives and Special Collections team, in partnership with the Digital Scholarship Services team, is processing a sampling of Professor K.D. Irani's personal and professional papers, which highlight the intellectual development of Professor Irani's ideas. The digitized sampling will be available on the digital library platform, JSTOR Forum.

FEZANA Information Research and Education System (FIRES) cochair Aban Rustomji talked about the preservation and digitization of damaged manuscripts and lithographs. She also discussed the digital recordings of oral histories that have been completed by the Zoroastrian Association of Houston.

Kersi Shroff presented the potential for gathering Zoroastrian artifacts scattered worldwide in a single digital collection. Imagine being able to walk through a gallery of old Zoroastrian arts and artifacts in faraway museums or excavations from your computer.

The session unlocked possibilities that could not have been imagined a decade ago and fired up the audience with what lies ahead
