New Event Coming in March

Your ZAH Library just completed a very successful year with five events that were widely appreciated. Attendance at these events set new records and we feel well rewarded for our efforts. As we start the new year, the Library has several exciting events planned for your enjoyment.

In March, we will have Sharmeen Mehri who will come down from New York to share with us her research on an oral history project that is her Ph.D. dissertation in the English department at the University at Buffalo. A Zoroastrian from Karachi, Pakistan, Sharmeen's research focuses on Parsi writing with an interdisciplinary focus on archival studies. She will talk about "Memories We Carry," an oral history project that is part of the wider South Asian American Digital Archive (SAADA) project. In this talk, she will share insights from the project and the value of preserving migration experiences of Zoroastrian South Asians to the United States. With a specific focus on the narrative of assimilation or dissimilation, these oral history interviews document how Zoroastrians preserve or adapt their cultural expressions within the context of the broader American immigrant experience.

This talk will complement very nicely the ongoing Oral History project that the Library started several years ago. That effort has been very



It was 2-nil Argentina at half-time. Everybody calmed down during the break with tea, batasas and khari biscuits.



Dilnavaz was the instructor for both the camps and recognized Delna's potential after Delna pitched her business idea to her and showcased her various projects done so far. She interviewed Delna and excerpted below is a write-up that appeared in the WZCC Newsletter Jan-Mar 2023.

Twelve year old Delna Surveyor has been actively involved in community fundraising activities and has started a business of selling her creations & teaching creativity to younger kids.

From a very young age, Delna has strongly demonstrated her desire to make a difference in her community, either through volunteering her time or raising money. Along with her brother Cyrus of 17 years, Delna has raised an amount of USD 3000.

Delna and her brother Cyrus have made wooden projects, refrigerator magnets, tote bags, ZAH logo keychains, and cross-stitch frames and have sold them at their booth during the annual Zoroastrian Association of Houston (ZAH) carnival in the past five years. Her cross-stitch frames have been greatly admired and have been given as gifts on many occasions by her customers.

Delna is also an artist, and her work has been featured in the ZAH Art Exhibition in 2022.

Delna has attended both the Global Youngpreneurs Academy Camps conducted by WZCC in summer of 2021 and 2022. She urges other youngsters and teens to be pro-active and learn from these workshops and to give back to the community that she is proud to be a part of.

She is now working on a project whereby she will be teaching classes for youngsters on how to do cross-stich and other creative embroidery.




