Then everyone moved to the main hall for the ceremony to begin. Our wonderful DJ Gary welcomed everyone with a small speech and Iranian music.



Project C.A.R.V. -

Be the change for Malak

Project C.A.R.V. (Community Awareness for Relationship Violence) was created in August 2022, as a dedication to a young girl, Malak. Malak is a close friend, who went through an abusive relationship with her boyfriend. Unfortunately, she was not supported by her community and this prolonged her bad experience in the relationship. Inspired by Malak's experience, Mishal Ali, Susana Pulido, Elizabell Vo, and I, Mahtab Dastur, started doing some research into how things could have been different for Malak.

We realized that there is no centralized source dedicated to helping victims of Teen Dating Violence (T.D.V.), or to direct them to various support organizations that can help them. So, the four of us decided to make it our mission to i) raise awareness regarding T.D.V. and ii) to create that source which teens can approach and access resources to help them. Thus, project C.A.R.V. was born.

Since its inception in August 2022, myself and the co-founders of Project C.A.R.V. have researched, talked to experts and created material for raising awareness regarding T.D.V. We have also done presentations for students at multiple different schools in our school district. We have also had dedicated awareness sessions for the nurses in our school district and beyond. We have raised awareness about T.D.V. by educating people on early signs of T.D.V. and how they can assist victims of T.D.V. We also partner with other organizations to host events and donation drives to raise awareness for T.D.V. Furthermore, at Northwest Assistance Ministries (NAM) we are in the process of establishing the first-ever Youth Board, that will provide a platform for youth where they can advocate for community concerns, such as relationship violence. In addition, we also continue to further the cause via various digital avenues that teens can easily access such as a website and an Instagram account (where we post information at least twice a week). Furthermore, we have created infographics and brochures, and distributed them across various schools and libraries. All this with the overall goal of raising awareness about TDV and providing resources to victims of TDV.

We urge everyone to raise their voice if they notice signs of relationship violence including bullying, because no one deserves to suffer in silence like our friend Malak did. To decrease the likelihood of T.D.V. in the future, it is essential that those who witness or experience it are comfortable to speak up on this sensitive topic. Only if we speak up and intervene, we can make a change to help T.D.V and other forms of violence and bullying come to a stop. It is important to remind friends and family that they are supported and not alone. For more information on Project C.A.R.V. and T.D.V., please refer to the brochure attached here. 



Why People

LEAVING AN ABUSIVE RELATIONSHIP

- Motivated by desire to achieve power and control over an intimate relationship
- Abusive people believe they can control and restrict their partners' lives
 - They believe they are priority
- Abuse is an acquired behavior.
- Those who perform abusive acts have a decision to do so, regardless of where they learn such tendencies - they might also choose not to.



Major Signs include but are not limited to:

- · Excessive envy of your peers or time spent apart from them.
- · Preventing you from spending time with friends, family members, or classmates.
- Insulting, degrading, or embarrassing you, particularly in public.
- You are being pushed to consume drugs or alcohol.



Stay:

Common reasons people stay:

- · Fear- Abuse victims are likely to be terrified of the repercussions caused by the abuser
- Normalized Abuse- If a person was raised in an abusive home, they may fail to perceive that their partner's actions are harmful or abusive
- · Lack of Resources-Survivors may be financially reliant on their abusive relationship or have a lack of necessities for life to turn to


