REPORTS

EC REPORT

Dear Members,

This year is starting out to be a very exciting year for the ZAH. In February, y'all overwhelmingly voted to build the Atash Kadeh. The new Atash Kadeh will fulfill our spiritual needs and will hopefully become a central hub for the entire North American Zoroastrian population. Our design team is working with the architect to develop the design for the Atash Kadeh.

Another exciting project is our Phase 3A development, which will include the Purvez Rustomji room and the middle group classroom. The final design of Phase 3A is completed and is attached below. The Purvez Rustomji room will be a multi media + multipurpose room, with state of the art audio visual equipment and conference capabilities.

In addition, it's time now to update the bathrooms, kitchen and the parking lot.

Vision 2020 Update:

The ZAH's strategic 7 year plan, code named Vision 2020, to raise \$750,000 in 7 years, is underway. The plan includes raising money for the new construction of the Atash Kadeh, the Purvez Rustomji room and a new classroom (Phase III-A). The money raised will also be to upgrade/enhance the parking lot, bathrooms and kitchen. A part of the fundraising will be used to build a reserve for the Building maintenance fund. The breakdown of the funds are:

GENETICS OF METABOLIC DISEASE IN PARSI FAMILIES: A RESEARCH STUDY

OBJECTIVES:

- To identify the genetic basis of medical problems in the Parsi community in the US
- · To understand the familial inheritance of these problems
- To identify the lifestyle factors that may increase the risk for the prevalent medical problems



RESEARCH ORGANIZATION: Department of Nutrition and UNC Nutrition Research Institute, University of North Carolina at Chapel Hill.



DESCRIPTION OF THE RECRUITMENT:

- For this study information related to family structure, basic demographics, dietary patterns, health habits, medical histories, anthropometrics and blood pressure measures will be collected from members of Parsi families
- We will collect blood spots and saliva samples for the genetic study.
- · All individuals 7 years or older can participate; there is no upper age limit for participation.
- We will email questionnaires and consent forms before the event. The questionnaires will be found on a secured website that can be accessed using a username and password. Those participants who request a hard copy will be mailed. Participants can fill the questionnaires in advance or on the day of the recruitment at the site.

Before filling out the questionnaires, all participants need to fill a consent form agreeing to participate in the study.

Note: ALL DATA WILL BE STRICTLY CONFIDENTIAL AND WILL BE STORED WITH THE PRINCIPAL INVESTIGATOR (Dr. SAROJA VORUGANTI). ALL INFORMATION WILL BE CODED AND ONLY THE CODED AND ANONYMIZED DATA WILL BE AVAILABLE TO CO-INVESTIGATORS FOR ANALYSIS.
