The much-awaited 24th Lecture Series of the ZAH Library/FIRES was held on Friday, November 10, and Saturday, November 11.

After light refreshment, the evening began with Aban Rustomji, Chair of the ZAH Library Committee, welcoming all the attendees. Aban introduced all the members of the Library Committee with a special recognition of the two new members Nazanin Sarkari and Sharmeen Mehri. We appreciated the presence of FEZANA President ArZan Wadia from New York and Aderbad Tamboli, Chairperson, ZAH.

Introduced by Aban, Jenny Rose, gave an informal talk on her background. Her grandmother was a Parsi from Rawalpindi. Jenny grew up in London and attended a university course taught by the famous Mary Boyce. Saturday, November 11

Introduced by Sharmeen Mehri, Jenny gave her featured talk: "Sheer-e-Shireen: Zoroastrians adding Sugar in the Milk", which was the basis of "good thoughts, good words, good deeds". Jenny remarked that this came to life with the tangible actions she witnessed in several areas across the globe – from sharing food at the Maidyozarem Gahambar in Taft, Iran to cooking Sirogh during Humbandagi at the California Zoroastrian Center. Her talk was followed by brief remarks on the Ava project by Mahtab Dastur and Natasha Dungor, two Houston teenagers who are active participants in this FEZANA project. A Breakout Session conducted by Jangoo Mistry followed Jenny's talk.

At the Breakout Session, groups of people seated at their tables were asked to focus on three questions and come up with simple, sustainable actions that could be implemented by the attendees. Numerous practical examples and suggestions were reported at the end of the breakout session. These have been gathered by the Library Committee and will be shared in the Special Edition of Manashni to be published shortly.

After the lunch break, introduced by Nazanin Sarkari, Meheryar Rivetna spoke on: "Politics and Power- the Birth of the Younger Avesta". Meheryar started by defining the difference between what the Older and Younger Avesta contained. Zarathustra, not wanting to accept traditions with blind faith, set out to acquire wisdom and determine for himself what the truth was. With the knowledge he received, Zarathustra preached a monotheistic religion and proclaimed Ahura Mazda to be the one and only God and Creator.

Tracing history from Cyrus the Great establishing the Achaemenid Empire, Meheryar related the decline and fall of the Zoroastrian religion. Separation of the church and state, as proclaimed by Cyrus the Great, was abandoned and the scheming Magi, through infiltration into the political structure of the times, became self-appointed true custodians of the Zoroastrian religion. Creating the Young Avesta, they gave us their version of the Niyashes and Yashts that have come down to us today. Citing numerous scholars and priests of our religion, Meheryar reiterated that the Gathas were the only genuine compositions of Zarathustra.

During the question-and-answer period, Barjor Dastur had a different view of history and presented to the community the views of other scholars regarding the origins of religious scriptures besides the holy Gathas.

The 80+ people who attended had a rewarding experience and felt that their time spent during the day was well worth it.

I learnt about it last year from our Houston Methodist Sugar Land project and did our own collection of toiletries and cash donations thanks to our friends.... then Yezdi and I personally delivered a whole carload to add on to the HMSL effort. It was a truly touching, humbling & rewarding experience! I have vowed to introduce this cause to as many folks as I can.

This past October they had a collection drive they named 'Socktober' with the goal of collecting socks, bras, underwear to their 'guests' that they serve with friendly care & respect. Last year, they had 2 mobile units and were trying to raise funds to purchase a third one. On designated days, they are offered a spot in the parking lot of churches/businesses where they hook up the shower van to their water supply, they try to get to different areas to reach and serve our underprivileged brethren.

Please, let us do a collection drive in time to deliver cash donations, socks, bras, underwear – all sizes. However, the most and urgently needed items are large bottles of shower gel/body wash, shampoo and conditioner. The *Moving Waters* provide 600 showers a month and these items go very fast. A ROMANTIC STORY OF YORE Story of the Wedding of Firozabanoo (Chapter 7 Kassa-e-Gulistanbanoo)

The Author of *Mumbai Bahar* and historian writes that Rustom Dorabji Patel was married three times. The first wife died and he remarried a second wife. And even though he had become middle-aged, he did not have any sons to carry on his name.

Rustomji's third marriage to *Firoza* was under strange circumstance. It is said that this Iranian lady had just come to Mumbai from Iran, and the reason for her coming to Mumbai was to get away from being persecuted. To escape from the religious persecution and oppression, her father Shiavakh (bin Dinyar) and her mother Ferangez, together with their three sons, converted to Islam, but kept their two daughters hidden from the oppressors who lived as Zarathushtis. The father wanted to send the daughters to Mumbai to get them married off to Zarathushtis. While Shiavakhsh was thinking about how to send his daughters to Mumbai, he came across a German traveler whose name could not be determined. This traveler happened to be a very respectable person and Shiavakh put his two daughters in his hands to take to Mumbai and leave them with someone reliable in a Parsi locality.

The German traveler himself showed a desire to marry one of them and take the other sister to Mumbai and leave her with some reliable Parsi family. Shiavax and the girls agreed to this arrangement – rather than get caught and be under abject conditions of the Muslims, one girl accepted to marry the German whereas the other preferred to travel with this German traveler to Mumbai and get married to a Zarathushti. They came to Mumbai where the German left the girl in charge of a respectable Parsi trader, Bhikha Behram, with a request to get her married off to a person of her choice and went to Germany with the other sister as his bride with her consent.

The girl who stayed in Mumbai was Firoza. She was born on Roj 15, Mah 7, of YZ 1097 (Saturday 2^{nd} May 1728 AD).

Where the present day Forbes Street in Fort area is, at that time, there was a pond by a Policemen's quarters. There, in the evening, many Parsis used to come in the evening to relax by the water. Here, Bhikha Behram brought Firoza to find a husband for her. Firoza looked at people sitting there but kept looking at Rustomji Dorabji Patel and went and held his hand. Rustomii got upset and got up and went away from this woman. But Firoza refused to look at anyone else who was sitting there. The next day Bhikha Behram again brought Firoza but Rustomji Patel had not come that evening, again, Firoza refused to look at anyone else and said that she will only marry the person whom she had seen the day before. Many people got together and persuaded and explained to him that he should really consider marrying her, particularly since he does not have any kids and that she may be able to give him the sons that he wanted. With this kind of pressure, Rustom Dorabji agreed and they were married. (History of the first Parsi Patels (Mumbai na pehela Parsi Patel-o ni tavarikh, Pages 14-15)
