Meiji Modern: Fifty Years of New Japan



A favorite accessory of well-known Japanese kabuki actors such as Ichikawa Danjurō IX (1838–1903), bowler hats made by the bamboo artist Hayakawa Shōkosai, became fashionable in the Meiji period (1856–1912), a time that saw new exposure to non-Japanese cultures and the transformation of fashion choices.



Billed as "A monumental exhibition" by the National Review, the exhibition offers an extraordinary look at Japan's Meiji era (1868–1912), when the country emerged from near-total isolation to enter a modern, global period. Over these pivotal decades, Japan experienced radical social and political shifts. The exhibition brings together nearly 200 remarkable works of Meiji art from more than 70 public and private collections.

Vehishta Kaikobad, who is a docent at the MFAH, offered to guide the Library Committee members through the highlights

of the exhibits. A group of about 20 people gathered at the Museum to see the exhibits. Vehishta's expertise in art history gave the visitors a deeper appreciation and a more educated interpretation of what we were looking at.

Through the objects on view, Meiji Modern reveals the profound cross-cultural impact of Japan's developing relationships with the wider world. Paintings, sculptures, prints, posters, and fine examples of enamel, lacquer, and textiles reflect a blending of cultures and techniques as well as the innovative interchange of old and new. This period marked the birth of Japanese Modern Art when Japanese artists sent their works to the great Exhibitions and World Fairs in Europe and America. Among the themes in the exhibition are the role of the sea in Japanese culture; changing gender roles; the nation's religion, traditions, and myths; and plants and animals embraced internationally as motifs for export.

The exhibition also features several recently discovered masterpieces of Japanese art, many of which have never been shown publicly.

Listed below are some things to note before donating:

- Bring a picture I.D.
- You MUST be at least 17 years old, weigh 110 lbs. and be in good health; or 16 years old, 122 lbs., and have a consent form signed by parent or guardian (attached below)
- Eat a nourishing meal before the donation but avoid fatty foods a day before
- Make sure to eat iron-rich foods such as lean meat or fish and leafy vegetables
- Drink plenty of water or fruit juice the night before and the morning of the donation
- Avoid caffeinated drinks as they may cause dehydration
- Get a good night's sleep!

#### After You Donate:

- Make sure to eat sodium-rich foods
- Drink more water to prevent dehydration
- Avoid strenuous activities such as sports or exercise for a day.

On the day of the donation, you will be provided a questionnaire to verify and affirm your donation.



#### **PUBLIC SERVICE ANNOUNCEMENT**

Find out whether your information was compromised.

The cyber intrusion involved National Public Data, a background check company. According to a statement from the company, the breach likely occurred in December 2023, with additional leaks in April 2024 and this summer. The compromised data includes names, email addresses, phone numbers, Social Security numbers, and mailing addresses. National Public Data is currently working with law enforcement to investigate the breach and will notify individuals whose information was exposed.

In the meantime, you can check if your information was compromised. The following website, operated by online security company Pentester, allows you to verify whether your data was stolen without requiring you to submit a Social Security number: <a href="https://npd.pentester.com">https://npd.pentester.com</a>

## WAS THERE ANY PARSI SETTLEMENT IN HINDUSTAN PRIOR TO 716 AD?

About seven shiploads of Iranian Zoroastrians from Iran came to this country about 12 centuries ago by sea. But that doesn't mean that Iranian Zoroastrians had not set foot in India prior to this Group or had stayed here. It's a fact that prior to this Group there were many Zoroastrians who had traveled North West by land for business or anything else, however, this was the first large group who had fled Iran to preserve their religion and for their personal safety and had come to Hindustan.

A priest named Henry Lord had come to Surat in 1620 A.D. In one of his books he had written that all together there were seven ships that had sailed from Div of which two had landed at Port Sumari near Surat and settled in some of the towns like Variav and Vankanair. The other five went further south and landed in the Gujrat port of Sanjan.

Our forefathers encountered a deadly storm after leaving Div, and they had pledged that if they got out alive, they would establish an Atash Behram in the first stop they make. To honor that pledge, they immediately started the work of settling in the small town of Sanjan. According to the book "Kiss-e-Sanjan" which is written to enumerate the events they started the process of establishing the Atash Behram. With the help of the Aalat that they had brought with them when they left Khorrasan, they were able to establish the Atash Behram within five years of their residence on the land given to them by Jadiv Rana for this purpose. The Atash Behram was established with all the splendor and pageantry in the year 721 A.D. and was given the name Paak Iranshah. This Atash accompanied them wherever they went.
