A Historic Display

The Museum of Fine Arts, Houston, is presenting a monumental exhibition, **Living with the Gods**, a thematic survey of major world faiths. The exhibition will display a spectacular collection of items loaned from across the globe, including the Metropolitan Museum of Art, the collection of His Highness The Maharaja of Jaipur, and the Zarathusti Heritage and Cultural Center. I slept and dreamt that life was all joy I awoke and saw that life was but service I served and understood that service was all joy Sir Rabindranath Tagore

The words below are who Sir Ratan Tata was in my late husband's and my life. The words in the quote above embodies what Ratan was in all aspects of his life globally.

My late husband, Dr. Meherwan Boyce met Ratan when they were in Campion School together in Bombay. They became friends. They kept in touch through the years and in the late 80's for a few years Ratan had an investment in our company Boyce Engineering International. We remained in touch. Some anecdotes of Ratan in our life follow.

When Ratan was the guest of honor at a University of Houston, Hilton School of Hotels gala, Dr. Renu Khator knew of our friendship, so we were her guests at her table with Ratan. Throughout the evening everyone walked up to him to greet him. He patiently greeted everyone. He had no time to eat but he said it is more important to greet the guests than to eat!

Ratan was revered and respected throughout India and the world. He had a great mind and a great strength of character and courage to act on his convictions and beliefs. Against the advice of many he bought Range Rover and Jaguar and made them a success globally. For Indians he built successfully the Nano an affordable small car.

He was a simple and an unassuming human being. Had no airs about him. Meherwan and I were in Bombay once and were going to see him that afternoon. We saw him driving on Marine Drive and we both pulled over. He was taking his dry cleaning to the dry cleaners himself!

He built very successful multinational companies and recognized the worth of human beings and the people he worked with. When he was Chairman of Air India International, he took the airline to great heights. He would walk everywhere within the company including the mechanics and even sit down and share their meals!

Ratan embodied the generous, giving, and nurturing spirit of his parents and ancestors. The quote from Sir Rabindranath Tagore I believe embodies the great man that he was.

He wove fabric with threads that made the fabric of everyone's life so great.

The most awesome part is that, for any person, there would a completely unknown hymn that could be playing at one time and then just like that it could shift to a known and familiar prayer. Further, it is a truly surreal experience to see various people from different religious backgrounds sitting together on a carpet and listening to prayers in different tongues, all in a beautiful symphony of sound.

The "Prayer" project was started by James Webb in South Africa in 2000 and since then it has been going through various iterations globally. Prayer (Houston) is the 12th version. And James mentioned, that he was pleased that he "finally got the Zoroastrian "kusti" prayers in his exhibits!". James started this project after South Africa ended its legislation of Apartheid. By making it so diverse, the artist is hoping to engender a spirit of co-existence.

ZAH was one of the organizations that participated in this project. ZAH members recorded some prayers: such as Ashem Vohu, the Ardibehesht Yasht Nirang, the Kusti prayer, Din No Kalmo, Dua Tandorosti, some Gatha fakras and some translations for the exhibits.

Prayer (Houston) is organized for the exhibition Makeshift Memorials, Small Revolutions. The artwork was co-produced by Blaffer Art Museum (Univ of Houston), Cynthia Woods Mitchell Center for the Arts and KADIST. And the exhibition is open to the public and is at the Blaffer Art Museum (4173 Elgin St, Houston TX 77004).

Madam Bhikhaiji Rustam Cama 1861-1936 Contributed by Aban Rustomji

On Republic day 1962, the Indian Posts and Telegraphs Department issued a special postage stamp to honor Madam Bhikhaiji Cama. Born on September 24, 1861, to an affluent Zoroastrian family, Sorabji and Jaijibhai Patel, her education was at the Alexandra Native Girls' English School in Bombay.

Bhikhaiji's marriage with Rustom Cama, the son of the renowned Oriental scholar, K. R. Cama, in 1885 was an arranged one. From an early age Bhikhaiji took a keen interest in social and political work and was not content with her household role.

In 1902, because of failing health, she left India for Europe, spending a year each in Germany, Scotland and France before settling down in London. She came in contact with many Indian revolutionaries. She started her political work in England under the guidance of Dadabhoy Naoroji and campaigned for his election to the British House of Commons. Her revolutionary speeches in the cause of India brought the wrath of British authorities. She started her own paper, the *Bande Mataram*.

On August 18, 1907, Madame Cama addressed the International Socialist Congress at Stuttgart, Germany. She gave an inspiring speech about the plight of her country. At the end of her speech she unfurled a tri-color flag in green, yellow and red with the words 'Bande Mataram' written on it, that became the Indian national flag.

Later she left for America where she sought help for the political emancipation in India. In a speech in America, she declared, "We are peaceful, we do not want a bloody revolution, but we do want to teach the people their rights and throw off despotism."

The British authorities looked upon her as a dangerous revolutionary and her movements were closely followed. She found it safer to move to Paris in 1909. Despite the vigilance of the British Government, she managed to send her leaflets and parcels to India. During the First World War, she was under surveillance and was interned. She lived in exile for 33 years in England and France. Physically handicapped by a paralytic stroke she was brought back to India by Sir Cowasjee in 1935 where she died a year later.

Bhikhaiji Cama lived her life as a deeply religious person who believed in the teachings of Zarathushtra to fight against injustice. Her personal assets were donated to the orphanage for girls and Rs.54,000 to her family temple in Mazgaon where a yearly ceremony is performed to remember her life as a courageous Zarathushti patriot.
