## 24 YEARS FOR SEPTEMBER 11 INCIDENT MY MEMORIES OF THAT DAY

September 11, 2001 – we were in Karachi for a family wedding.

My sister, Mahrukh, and I had made plans to go to Karachi for the wedding, and on the return home, go to London to catch Cosmos Travels for a European tour for a couple of weeks. Sounds fantastic, right? But the higher powers had a different plan for us.

That fateful day in September, we were at the Adarni ceremony at Beach Luxury Hotel from 5:00 pm (8:00 am in New York) completely oblivious of what was happening in New York. As other invitees started arriving a little later, we got the story. Not one but two planes had hit both World Trade Center (WTC) Towers. Later we learned that four places were targeted.

Mahrukh and her husband Rohi were in a panic and were desperate to reach their daughter Spenta who worked in an attorney's office not very far from WTC Towers. They couldn't contact anyone as the phone lines were down throughout the U.S.. After nearly two hours, Mahrukh was able to contact her son Cyrus who assured her that Spenta was safe back from work. Happy and relieved, we proceeded to enjoy the Adarni dinner.

The next day we got a message from Cosmos Travel that the tour was cancelled. Needless to say we were very disappointed.

As soon as the air traffic was restored, Mahrukh and Rohi left for New York. Hoshang and I stayed till our scheduled date of departure. While still in Karachi, the VP of my department called and asked if everything was OK for us and to contact him should I need any help. I was very touched by this gesture.

Well, our flight to Houston had a lay over in Paris – Charles de Gaulle Airport – for six hours. Before boarding the flight to Houston, we had to go through security. Hoshang and I were pulled aside for questioning since we were coming from Pakistan. After the regular questioning of names etc., the next question stunned me – the security officer said “who paid for your ticket”. Not grasping the significance of the question, I said “we did”. If he asked this question once, he asked three times in three different ways. The third time he asked, I just glared at him. He then asked whether I worked. “Yes”, I said. “Where”? I said “Oil Company”. “Do you have a business card” he asked? Now, normally I

don't carry my business card when I am traveling but frantically searching my purse, I found one. I gave it to him. He took it to his office probably to check the veracity of my card. The Security Officer came back after five minutes or so and cleared us for travel to the U.S. Whew, were we glad to board the homeward bound plane.

Its been 24 years since this incident and I wonder how many people remember this *attack on the United States*.

## **Asha: The Path To Righteous Living**

What is righteousness? Righteousness is living according to the Truth inherent in the **Order in Nature**. Zarathustra represented the virtues Truth, Righteousness, the Order in Nature as *Asha*, an attribute of Ahura Mazda. *Asha* is the characteristic that humans must incorporate within themselves in order to live a happy, meaningful life. It is through *Asha* that humankind can further its own betterment and that of the world, defeating all that is detrimental to its well-being.

"Humans are nature's highest creation. This conclusion comes from the fact, as Zarathustra articulated, that nature has endowed human beings among all its creation with the capacity to think. And it is this capacity that allows humankind to have a relationship with nature. Zarathustra was the first to realize that for humans to understand nature and its laws (Ahura Mazda) it was critical to have a 'Good Mind' **to link this faculty of the mind to natural order**". (1). [Emphasis added].

"Zoroaster **conceived of the order of nature**, with laws uniformly operating which it is the duty of a man to observe and learn, as God's (Ahura Mazda's) laws operating in nature, as the manifestation of the workings of the Good Mind of God, as the product of the rules of the Right and so of God... **The law of God (Ahura Mazda) which Zoroaster recognized** and worshipped, was inimical to all that is destructive, and fostered beneficence everywhere." (2). [Emphasis added].

"God, as Zarathustra realized and discovered was no finite Being. Two essential qualifications are needed to understand the God of the Universe, as Zarathustra understood Him. The first qualification is to practice Righteousness (Law of *Asha*) without any desire for material reward or gain. Every kind of virtue is to be practiced purely for the sake of virtue itself. The second qualification is **to understand and to assimilate the Unchanging Laws of Nature, at work in the Universe. These Laws of Nature are unceasingly at work in every form of Creation**. Zarathustra came to a perfect understanding of the One Great Law of '*Asha-Vahishta*'." (3). [Emphasis added].

The Zoroastrian religion does not promote *worship* of nature. It calls for humans *to live* according to the laws of nature.

The laws of nature (the order in nature) are fixed and cannot be altered by any petition or wishful thinking. It is human responsibility to live in compliance with those laws (*Asha*) for the fulfillment of a beneficent life.
