The ZAH Library Committee seeks ways to fulfill its mission: "To serve as a leading repository of knowledge that fosters the awareness and study of the Zoroastrian religion, history, traditions and culture". Our collection has been growing steadily in books and interesting artifacts donated to us. We have had programs that have been entertaining and, we hope, have provided intellectual stimulation as well. Our annual events are attended by the FEZANA President which brings a wider recognition, use, and support of the ZAH Library. Family attendance is encouraged so all can take full advantage of our resources and facility.

ACCOMPLISHMENTS

- Meheryar Rivetna generously pledged to donate proceeds from his book, Zarathushtra: The Man and the
 Message to the ZAH Library, starting with an initial sale of 90 books at the launch. Sales surpassed
 expectations, reaching countries like Germany, France, Japan, Australia, Brazil, and the Netherlands.
 To date he has donated \$2085 to the library through the sale of his book. Congratulations and
 gratitude to Meheryar Rivetna.
- Sharmeen Mehri visited the YMZA library located at the Dinshaw Avari Colony in Karachi. The library holds the Dastur Dr. Dhalla collection. The collection has 4000 plus books, magazines, pamphlets, and other rare materials in various languages. Currently, Dinshaw Avari is in the process of digitizing the collection, after which, the FIRES committee will work towards bringing together the Dastur Dr. Dhalla collection from Karachi to the Dhalla Trust's collection at the ZAH Library.
- The FIRES committee is currently seeking volunteers to conduct oral history interviews or to edit
 interview transcripts and video/audio. Please contact Sharmeen Mehri at <u>oralhistory@fezana.org</u> if

- At the Parliament of World's Religions in August 2023 in Chicago, the ZAH Library/FIRES created a Cyrus Exhibit that drew a lot of attention from attendees. We also had a display of several books from our collection called *Flames of Wisdom: A Journey of Zoroastrian Texts*.
